Deberá relacionar cada persona con el alojamiento más adecuado. **Sólo un alojamiento es correcto para cada persona.** Deberá **elegir la respuesta correcta** rodeando con un círculo la letra de su opción en la **HOJA DE RESPUESTAS.**
